Student Evaluation:

Final grades will be determined by the average using the following criteria:

- Gold Category (Summative Assessments) = 40% Tests, essays, research papers, project-based assignments.
- **Silver Category (Short Cycle Assessments) = 35%** Quizzes, lab reports, assignments that build to gold, collaborative work.
- Bronze Category (Classwork/Warm-Up) = 25% Homework, spiral review activities, bellringers.
